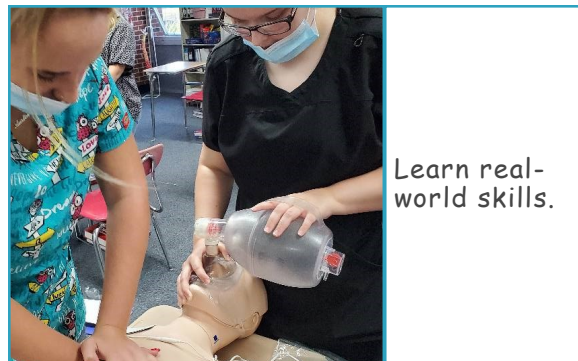
What will you learn?

- A Work-Based Learning experience which combines high school credits with employment in a participating healthcare facility.

Potential for earning **certifications, in addition to the college credits!**

- * Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers CPR (an American Heart Assn. certification)
- * **CCMA** (Certified Clinical Medical Assistant) certification thru National Healthcareer Association. Must pass national exam to earn this.
- * College courses offered: Intro to Health Careers, Medical Terminology, Dementia Care, Medical Assisting — all give students the opportunity for Ivy Tech credits. **Dementia Care is an Ivy Tech Technical Certificate. Program**
