PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Automotive Service Tech program will provide basic automotive service skill development that can lead to entry-level jobs in dealerships, independent shops, parts stores or specialty shops, such as brakes, tires or exhaust shops. College credit can be earned while students are in the program at no additional cost. The student will have active participation in life skill classes, including employability skills, personal growth and leadership skills. In addition, communication skills, career exploration and assistance in making informed choices in reference to post-secondary career/education plans are a component of the course.

Occupations upon completion of class: Parts salesman, general mechanic, service advisor/writer, entry level technician, small engine mechanic, tire service

Additional education/training available at: Ivy Tech, Lincoln Tech, the military, University of Northwestern Ohio, Universal Technical Institute, and Vincennes University
